

Preventing Nuclear Terrorism

Whereas the accelerating spread of nuclear weapons, nuclear know-how and nuclear material has increased the possibility that the deadliest weapons ever invented could fall into dangerous hands; and

Whereas former U .S. officials with extensive experience, including the overwhelming majority of secretaries of state and defense and national security advisors, have advised that steps being taken now to address this threat are not adequate to the danger; and

Whereas retired U .S. generals are calling nuclear weapons inherently dangerous, hugely expensive, militarily inefficient and morally indefensible; and

Whereas the U.S. public has a growing interest and strong positive response to the addressing of this issue;

Therefore, be it resolved that the United States President and Congress (1) make the threat of nuclear terrorism America's #1 security priority and (2) work with other countries and the United Nations to immediately implement actions that will secure fissile material to a high standard and abolish nuclear weapons worldwide.
